
Plurals and Pronunciation

Many words in English form their plural form by adding an "s" on the end of the word.



Sometimes the "s" is pronounced with a hissing, "snake" sound:



Ssssssss

The word "Cats" is pronounced "Cats(ssss)"

Other times, the "s" is pronounced with a buzzing, "bee" sound:



The word "Dogs" is pronounced "Dogz(zzzz)."



"Regular" plurals- just add "s"

Some words that end in "y" make a plural by replacing the "y" with "ies":

Umbrellas

Violins

Zebras

Singular (1) Plural (2+)

Baby	Babies	(Zzzz)
Party	Parties	(Zzzz)
Patty	Patties	(Zzzz)
Fly	Flies	(Zzzz)

Other words have plural forms that are very different than the singular:

Singular (1) Plural (2+)

Man Men
Goose Geese
Woman Women
Child Children
Mouse Mice
Cactus Cacti

There are a few words where the singular and plural are the same:

Singular (1)	Plural (2+)
Sheep	Sheep
Aircraft	Aircraft
Fish	Fish (or fishes)
